

Forest Management Certification Assessment of SFU Maglizh in Maglizh, Bulgaria [07.11.2016]

Introduction - NEPCon is conducting forest management and chain of custody certification assessments of the SFU Maglizh located in Maglizh, Bulgaria. The assessment will be implemented from 21 to 23 December 2016.

Scope of the Certification Assessment – The forest management certification assessment will assess the environmental, silvicultural and socioeconomic aspects of the [FORESTS] [or] [PLANTATIONS] managed by SFU Maglizh, using the *NEPCon Interim Standard Bulgaria 19Dec14*; *NEPCon CoC Standard for FME 19Dec14*. To obtain a copy of the applicable guidelines or to make comments about these standards, please contact NEPCon by telephone, FAX, email or website listed below. Please note that the standard may be modified to take account of stakeholder comments. NEPCon is accredited by the Forest Stewardship Council™(FSC™) and this assessment process must follow procedures which have been approved by the FSC.

The forest under evaluation contains areas either identified as High Conservation Value Forests or where high conservation values, as defined by the FSC, are likely found. NEPCon evaluates the identification, management and protection of these High Conservation Values and solicits related comments from stakeholders.

Assessment Team Composition - The assessment team will be led by Zoya Markova (Bulgaria). The team members will be: Teodor Todorov (Bulgaria), Nikolai Tochilov (Russia) and Miko Pavlov (Bulgaria).

Assessment Steps and Schedule – Following is a short description of the certification process and a tentative agenda:

- ♦ Assessment organization – NEPCon team will assemble in SFU Maglizh.
- ♦ Field assessments – The team will visit sites managed by SFU Maglizh from 21 to 23 December 2016.
- ♦ Stakeholder consultation – Throughout the fieldwork, the team will contact local stakeholders regarding SFU Maglizh forest management in villages surrounding the forest area. This will include private interviews and discussions, and public stakeholder meetings.
- ♦ Public stakeholder meetings – A public stakeholder meeting will be held in SFU Maglizh a centrally located public meeting place for SFU Maglizh. Date, time, and location will be announced soon.
- ♦ Final assessment briefing – Prior to departure the team will meet with SFU Maglizh managers and other parties to finalize their data collection and present preliminary findings.
- ♦ Draft report production – The assessment team will produce a confidential draft report that will be circulated for comment to SFU Maglizh and a minimum of 2 independent peer reviewers. This should occur 30 days after completion of the assessment.
- ♦ Certification decision – Upon receipt of comments on the draft report from SFU Maglizh forest managers and independent peer reviewers, and other general stakeholder comments, NEPCon will reach a certification decision.

Your Input Sought – As a part of the forest certification assessment process we invite stakeholders to offer comment and feedback on SFU Maglizh forest management in relation to conformance with the requirements of the forest management standard referenced above as well as comments on the FME's management and protection of High Conservation Values within the forest under evaluation. We welcome input, either public or confidential, in whatever form is easiest and most secure for you. Your input will be valuable at any stage of the assessment process, but we would prefer to receive your comments either prior to the assessment, during the assessment, or prior to 23 November so that we can take them into consideration in reaching a certification decision. Your options for communicating your observations to us are as follows.

1. Meet with a NEPCon assessment team member during or shortly after the fieldwork.
2. Call and give comments to Teodor Todorov, NEPCon staff person responsible for coordinating this certification assessment from Regional office Bulgaria. If Teodor Todorov is not in the office, please give your comments to either present staff.
3. Submit written comments by mail or email to Teodor Todorov. Unless you request otherwise, these comments will be kept confidential and are solely for the purposes of assessing the SFU Maglizh.

The source of any information provided will be kept confidential available to only to FSC and NEPCon staff.
